
In the 2020-2021 School Year:

Cherokee County's First Class Pre-K Classrooms are located in:

- O Community Organization Operated
- 1 Child Care
- Faith Based
- O Head Start
- O Private School
- 7 Public School
- University Operated

To reach 70 percent of all four-year-olds, Cherokee County would need approximately:

2 additional First Class Pre-K Classrooms \$240,000 in additional funding*

\$50,000 in one time start-up costs

*The additional funding can come from a combination of local, state, federal, or other sources.
